





Homelessness has been on the rise in central lowa for the past four years. **The number of homeless individuals Joppa served more than doubled from 2021 to 2023, and continues to rise.** This trend emerged from the affordable housing crisis, worsened during the pandemic and has only increased due to inflation. Many of our neighbors have no options, home, or hope.

SERVICE THROUGH HOPE

On any given night, nearly 1,000 central lowans have no place to call home. Many of our neighbors spend nights in their cars, under bridges and even in the woods as they try to muster up enough hope to carry them through the night. That's where Joppa comes in. We help homeless families and individuals survive, find housing and rebuild their lives and work to end homelessness by:

- Engaging volunteers and community partners in service
- Helping homeless families and individuals access government-funded resources and other assistance
- Filling gaps in homeless services, housing and education and mobilizing private donations from families, churches and organizations.

For over 800 consecutive weeks, we have offered love, support and hope through outreach with meals, water, supplies, transportation assistance and agency referrals.

Since 2008, Joppa has evolved from a weekly day of service into an impactful, hope-filled ministry. As the number of people experiencing homelessness in Des Moines continues to grow, our donor and volunteer support base must keep pace to maintain and increase our level of impact. Joppa is lifting an average of one family or individual off the streets each week - more than 600 individuals total, with over 80% remaining in homes today!


